



MICHAEL F. HOGAN, Ph.D.

Biographical Sketch

Dr. Michael Hogan was confirmed in March 2007 as Commissioner of Mental Health in New York. The NYS Office of Mental Health operates 25 accredited psychiatric hospitals, and oversees New York's \$5B public mental health system that serves 650,000 individuals annually. Dr. Hogan served as Director of the Ohio Department of Mental Health (1991-2007) and Commissioner of the Connecticut DMH from 1987-1991. He chaired the President's New Freedom Commission on Mental Health in 2002-2003, and was appointed as the first behavioral health representative on the board of The Joint Commission in 2007. He served (1994-1998) on NIMH's National Advisory Mental Health Council, as President of the National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors (2003-2005) and as Board President of NASMHPD's Research Institute (1989-2000). He has received leadership awards from the National Governor's Association, the National Alliance on Mental Illness, the Campaign for Mental Health Reform, the American College of Mental Health Administration and the American Psychiatric Association. He is a graduate of Cornell University, earned a M.S. degree from the State University College in Brockport NY, and a Ph.D. from Syracuse University. He is married and has three grown sons.
