Mr. Bergman brings over 40 years of experience at the local, state and national levels in disability advocacy, policy and community services provision. Most recently he served as the President & CEO of Anixter Center, one of Chicago's largest providers of community services and supports for children and adults with a variety of disabilities. With a budget of over \$31 million, Anixter provided services and supports to over 5,000 individuals through 420 staff, at 37 locations and hundreds of natural sites. Prior to his work in Chicago, Mr. Bergman spent 18 years in Washington, D.C.; 6 as the President and CEO of the Brain Injury Association of America and 12 as the Deputy Director and Director of Governmental Relations for United Cerebral Palsy Associations. He is recognized as a national expert on health care, managed care, Medicaid, Medicare and long term services and supports.

## The Burton Blatt Institute (BBI)

The Burton Blatt Institute (BBI), located at Syracuse University, is an interdisciplinary research institute dedicated to advancing civic, economic, and social participation of persons with disabilities in a global society. Blatt was dean of the School of Education and Centennial Professor at Syracuse University, served as director of SU's Division of Special Education and Rehabilitation, and founded the Center on Human Policy to promote a more open and accepting society for persons with disabilities.
